2019 FIELD TRIPS

STEAM – Transforming STEM with Art + Design Field Trips: May 28–June 7 (may add May 20-24 if needed)

The 2019 exhibit is an interdisciplinary exhibition that celebrates STEAM - Transforming STEM with Art + Design. The region's most distinguished design artists, the Northwest Designer Craftsmen, will present works that reflect innovative, real-world applications of science, technology, engineering, and math in the design and creation of Art. Opening Reception: April 25.

Field Trips last 75 minutes and include a docent led tour, artists in action, and a hands-on activity.

Cost is \$50.00 per class, up to 30 students. Appointment times are 9:15-10:30, 10:45-12:00, and 12:15-1:30.

WORKSHOPS AND CLASSES

Workshop – STEAM – Transforming STEM with Art + Design is scheduled for November 2 & 3.

Transforming STEM with Art + Design will focus on student engagement through hands-on visual art techniques for working to solve interdisciplinary challenges. Participants will learn ways to enhance their curriculum through visual art, STEM, and the humanities. All activities will connect and align with the WA State Arts Learning Standards, the Creative Process, and Design Thinking. Incorporating Art + Design into STEM will heighten participants understanding on how to empower students to open their imaginations and gain fresh perspectives on the world. Intensive hands-on break-out sessions will be presented by experienced artists and learning specialists. Assessment strategies will be discussed and all activities are designed to be class-time efficient. Available for SPU credit/clock hours or Everett SD clock hours. This course does meet the STEM requirement for certification.

Art Docent Fair: Artists Connected to the PNW Students Should Know, November 17, 8:45–12:15 p.m. Come and see artists in action and learn art projects you can do in the classroom. Six options will be offered and from those, participants will choose 4 of the 6 sessions to attend. One session will cover “How to Present a Work of Art” with the other five exploring the elements of art through well-known artist’s having ties to the Pacific Northwest. Cost: \$20 per person or \$100 per school (maximum 10 packets per school). Registration form below.

Classes – Art Technique – Art How2’s 2019: Designing Collaborative Creative Learning Experiences consists of 4 evening sessions (Apr. 17, 24, May 1, 8), 6-8:30 p.m. In this workshop participants will learn how to facilitate the design thinking process by using their own curriculum to frame their lessons, make connections to other content areas, and acquire techniques for guiding students toward developing the necessary mindset and skills to thrive in today’s world. Topics include Discovery and Ideation, Refining Ideas and Working with Constraints, Experimentation and Prototypes, and Presentations as a grand finale. Available for SPU credit/clock hours or Everett SD clock hours.

Workshop Goal / Course Objectives / Learning Outcomes

Workshop goal is to provide a foundation of learning for designing projects to effectively enhance stem curriculum with visual art and humanities. Course Objectives / Learning Outcomes:

- To help students develop creative confidence that, when given a difficult problem, they have a variety of methods for coming up with a solution.
- To understand how to design lessons that will engage students toward finding creative solutions to presented challenges. The IDEA Process: Identify, Define, Explore, Assess.
- To learn how a well-designed object can enrich the environment, hold the attention of the audience, foster communication, and add an emotional depth to an experience.
- To introduce teachers to the Schack Art Center spring exhibit following the same theme, as a possible field trip opportunity that will further deepen the learning of *Transforming STEM with Art + Design*.
- To provide a standards base for understanding interdisciplinary instructional techniques, pertaining to Common Core State Standards (CCSS) in math, Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), and WA State Arts Learning Standards; *including* Media Arts Standards - unique to WA State.

Who is the workshop for? Teachers, youth service providers, parent volunteers, art docents, and interested individuals who want to improve their knowledge and skill and thereby feel more comfortable in teaching and creating art.
