2020 FIELD TRIPS

NW Coast Native American Exhibit Featuring David Boxley and Chris Hopkins Field Trips

May 26–June 5 (may add June 8-12 if needed)

The 2020 exhibit celebrates the collaboration between artists David Boxley and Chris Hopkins who even though from very different backgrounds and cultures speak with one voice using the common language of art to communicate a story of the NW Coast Native American people. Opening Reception: April 23.

Field Trips last 75 minutes and include a docent led tour, artists in action, and a hands-on activity.

Cost is \$50.00 per class, up to 30 students. Appointment times are 9:15-10:30, 10:45-12:00, and 12:15-1:30.

The Schack encourages teens to visit our center to watch glass blowing demonstrations, observe local artists and visit project stations to express their creativity.

WORKSHOPS AND CLASSES

Workshop – Connecting STEM to NW Tribal Art & Culture is scheduled for October 25 & 26.

This interactive workshop will explore cultural aspects of the NW Coast Native Americans. Participants will learn how resources were utilized within their environment and attain ideas for integrating the required OSPI tribal sovereignty curriculum into other content areas. Participants will gain an understanding of NW Coast Natives as the “first scientists,” and discover their use of technology, engineering and mathematics, all within the notable features of their visual art. Through visual art processes, ideas will be shared to engage students’ learning and spark imagination with innovative hands-on projects that support students’ learning. In an interactive manner, STEM – in tandem with Art – will guide participants to apply creative skills they already possess. This course does meet the STEM requirement for certification. Assessment strategies will be discussed and all activities are designed to be class-time efficient. Available for clock hours through Everett SD or through OSPI for districts outside of Everett.

Art Docent Fair: Explore Materials Used by Artists Students Should Know, November 16, 8:45–12:15 p.m. Come and see artists in action and learn art projects you can do in the classroom. Six options will be offered and from those, participants will choose 4 of the 6 sessions to attend. One session will cover “How to Present a Work of Art” with the other five exploring the elements of art through a variety of art materials well-known artists have used. Cost: \$20 per person or \$100 per school (maximum 10 packets per school). NEW: Free OSPI Clock Hours for Teachers. Registration form below.

Classes – Art Technique – Art How2’s 2020: STEM-2-STEAM: Integrate! Innovate! Imagine... consists of 4 evening sessions (Apr. 15, 22, 29 & May 6), 6-8:30 p.m. In this workshop participants will be provided with interactive hands-on projects for guiding their students toward a creative and fun *end-of-school-year*. Each project will have a framework adaptable to grade level abilities, alignment to Arts Learning Standards and integrate innovative STEM components. Participants will apply relationships and common themes that connect science, technology, engineering, math, and visual arts. All supplies will be provided along with resources for budget-friendly and recyclable materials. Available for OSPI clock hours or Everett SD clock hours.

Workshop Goal / Course Objectives / Learning Outcomes

Workshop goal: Through visual art processes, participants will gain insight and understanding of ways NW Coast Natives applied STEM practices to utilize natural resources and produce culturally relevant artwork.

Course Objectives / Learning Outcomes:

- Participants will acquire ideas for employing authentic STEM connections in their own classrooms.
- Participants will be empowered to use visual art for engagement and creative thinking with their students.
- Participants will learn ways to enrich STEM areas through visual art with a focus on the cultural relevance of NW Coast artwork.
- Participants will develop an awareness of formlines in NW Coast designs as the connected pattern of painted, positive space.
- Participants will make the connection between technology as techniques or methods by which something is created with tools, and the importance of hands-on work.
- Participants will acquire ideas for adaptation, inclusion, and differentiation for implementation within their own classrooms.

Who is the workshop for? Teachers, youth service providers, parent volunteers, art docents, and interested individuals who want to improve their knowledge and skill and thereby feel more comfortable in teaching and creating art.
